Here at The Orchard, the summer months afford us the opportunity to hear first-hand from our missionaries . . . who they are, what they are doing, and what is happening in their ministry to reach the world for Christ.

While our normal Sunday morning programs (i.e. Sunday school & Adult Electives) take a break for the summer, we will use the space for **Summer Sunday Missions at The Orchard**.

After the first service, stop by **The Orchard Café** in the Douglas Room (starting July 11), grab a cup of coffee or tea and a snack and then head to the **chapel** for some inspiring times of hearing what God is doing in other parts of our world!

July 4 – Indonesia & Unreached People Groups

It will be our privilege on this Sunday in the sanctuary to commission **Justin and Courtney** into full-time, career missions with New Tribes Mission in Indonesia. They will then come to the chapel to share their new venture as a missionary helicopter pilot in Sulawesi, Indonesia . . . a very mountainous island where there are many unreached animistic and Muslim people groups.



Tim Stoker is with Wycliffe Bible Translators. Today about 350 million people do not have the Bible in their own language. Wycliffe's vision is to see the Bible accessible to all people in the language they understand best. They work from first word to the final printing to bring the Word of God to unreached people groups. Tim will be sharing about the ministry of Wycliffe and his role in the financial support aspect of helping this wonderful organization to be effective in its ministry.



July 11 – Spotlight on Reaching Muslims in Indonesia and the Strategic Role of Serving Children of Missionaries—Part 1

Our involvement in Indonesia began 20 years ago when a young single man left our congregation with a one-way ticket to Indonesia. Today, after many years of diligent strategy and ministry, it has grown into one of the largest and most effective ministries to Muslims. **Mike D.** will share about this ministry and how our Southeast Asia World Impact Project this year will support this increasingly successful outreach.



Bjorn and Trisha Olsen were raised in our church and are now deeply involved in giving great support to missionary families by ministering to their children at the International Christian School of Budapest (ICSB). This place of ministry has also been a platform for reaching into a largely non-Christian culture with very encouraging results. What are missionary kids like? Why is it so critical to help them? The Olsens will give an update on their ministry.



July 18 – Spotlight on Reaching Muslims in Indonesia and the Strategic Role of Serving Children of Missionaries—Part 2

Stephen C. worked side by side with Mike D. (see above) for 18 years in Indonesia developing the strategy to reach Muslims. He is now working to bring this effective strategy training to nine other nations. This new initiative will also be a part of our Southeast Asia World Impact Project his year.



Bob and Vicki McCollum were sent by our church to El Camino Academy, Bogotá, Colombia, where they are returning for their third year. Because of them



many missionary families are able to continue to serve where they are. Their report on the transition from the public high school in Glenview to their current ministry will give you a glimpse of the need and the opportunities for serving the Lord and missionaries through education.

July 25 – God at Work in the Middle East

Dennis and Wendy have very unique ministries to Arabs in the Middle East: challenging the abuse of women and training national leaders. Their heart for reaching Muslims and their dogged determination to reach and train those they have been called to is contagious. Come and hear their stories.



August 1 – Orphanage Ministry in a Dangerous City and Training Nationals to Preach

Beth Henkels spent five months in Juarez, Mexico, at Emmanuel Ministries where she was a dorm mother and general helper for the children she cared for. For an 18-year-old, this was a remarkable task to take on. She has much to share about caring for children who otherwise would have little hope in life.



Training national pastors to preach effectively from the Scriptures is an enormous need. **Greg Scharf**, Chair of the Pastoral Theology Department at Trinity International University, was recently in Trinidad teaching and preaching to train national pastors and to form preachers' clubs so that these pastors could encourage each other in the ministry of the Word. Get a wider world perspective on the needs of national churches around the world!



August 8 – Caring for Students Overseas and Reaching Students in our Own Country

Kim Berliner is a special education teacher at the International Christian School in Budapest, Hungary. She is also a great mentor and friend to the many students who need special care and



attention during this critical time in their lives. How does Kim make it possible for missionaries to stay in the field and help their children grow and mature spiritually? Come and hear her heart . . . and stories.

College and university students in the States need Jesus too! **Jason Maas** is on staff with *DiscipleMakers* in Pennsylvania and serves as the backbone of much that happens on the front lines. He will share about both the direct outreach to students and the need for the behind-the-scenes support to help make evangelism and discipleship happen.



August 15 – The High School Mission Trips



Reaching students with the Gospel is the reason for this group of **high school students** to minister through English as a Second Language (ESL) camp in Budapest, Hungary.

A second group will again be at Inner City Impact in Chicago to help run the day camp for underprivileged inner-city children as well as help with the youth group programs. There will be plenty to hear about!

August 22 – Youth Ministry in Europe and a Slum Outreach in India

Jeremy Schambach will be sharing about his experience of cross-cultural ministry teaching in Europe through conversational English, helping run children's clubs, teen meetings and activities for families. You will enjoy Jeremy's great sense of humor as he shares with us!



John Andrew and his son, **David**, were recently in India where John assisted Emmanuel Hospital Association with Human Resources issues. David, age 15, spent his time in the



slums ministering to those in need. What's it like to live in a slum . . . and for a young teen to have such an experience?

August 29 – Seminary Training of Hispanic Nationals around the World, via Internet

Henry and Marcette Happ serve with ReachGlobal in Costa Rica and are deeply involved in a web-based training of Hispanic nationals around the world.
