For the past weeks, The Orchard family has been challenged as Pastor Colin has so clearly shown the incredible difference between “dying in your sins” and “dying in the Lord.”

After hearing the truth from God’s Word, Tom Schowalter, part of our Itasca Campus, felt clearly that he needed to go to the hospital to visit his aunt, who was very ill and not a believer. He was obedient to God’s promptings and went to see her. She was open to Tom’s words. She said she understood and then let Tom pray with her. He was amazed how God orchestrated the encounter, how the room was suddenly quiet; no one came to give care until he had said, “Amen.”

Tom’s aunt died the next morning. At her funeral, Tom took great comfort in knowing that he had been able to share Christ with her before she died.

Over the New Year’s holiday, Joy Axelson went to her office on her day off; she had extra work to do. Of the 70 colleagues usually there, only one was working. Joy had always assumed that he was a Muslim—most people from his country are. He shared that he had worked a lot of hours over Christmas, but that didn’t bother him since his parents had raised him with no religion.

When Joy asked him what he believed, he said that if you live a good life, you will go to heaven. Joy asked pointed questions: *Then, why did Jesus have to die? How do you know when you have been good enough?* She shared that she sins in thought or deed every day, and so, if that were true, she would be in trouble. He nodded in agreement.

Joy “happened” to have a copy of *More Than a Carpenter* at her desk. She told her friend that he could borrow it. He asked if he could keep it awhile so that his wife could read it. As Joy left the office, she saw that this man was reading the book.

Joy said, “My resolution for this year was to share Christ with three people. This was January 2, and I am praising God for my good start.” She is hoping that this will be just the beginning of conversations that will lead her colleague to new life in Christ.
